REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

The directors present the non-statutory annual report and financial statements of Yorkshire Power Finance Limited (the "Company") for the year ended 31 December 2017. The Company is registered in the Cayman Islands and is a subsidiary of Northern Powergrid Holdings Company, which is incorporated in the United Kingdom. The directors have prepared these non-statutory financial statements to enable the Company to comply with its obligations under an agreement known as the "Trust Deed" pertaining to the issue, management and amortisation of the bond issue of £200 million 7.25% notes due in 2028. As permitted by the Companies Act 2006, the directors have applied the small companies' exemption from preparing a Strategic Report.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND RESULT FOR THE YEAR

The Company is registered in the Cayman Islands and acts as the issuer of long-term debt securities in order to raise finance for Yorkshire Power Group Limited, its immediate parent company, and other companies in the Northern Powergrid Holdings Company group (the "Northern Powergrid Group"). The Company met its obligation to make the annual interest payment on its debt securities on 4 August 2017.

The Company made a profit after tax for the year of £359,000 (2016: £388,000). The profit before tax at £444,000 was £41,000 lower than 2016, mainly reflecting lower finance income as a result of lower interest rates received on the Company's cash and cash equivalents.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

The Directors manage the Company's operations on a group basis. The development, performance and position of Northern Powergrid Holdings Company, which include those of the Company, are discussed in the annual report and financial statements of Northern Powergrid Holdings Company.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks and uncertainties are integrated with the principal risks of the group and are not managed separately. Accordingly, the principal risks and uncertainties, which include those of this Company, are discussed in the annual report and financial statements of Northern Powergrid Holdings Company. Details of financial risks can be found on page 3 of the Report of the Directors.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

DIVIDENDS

No dividend was paid during the year (2016: £Nil) and the directors recommend that no final dividend be paid in respect of the year.

The Company's dividend policy is that dividends will be paid only after having due regard to available distributable reserves, available liquid funds and the financial resources and facilities needed to enable the Company to carry on its business for at least the next year.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Company does not undertake research and development.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS AND FUTURE OUTLOOK

The financial position of the Company, as at 31 December 2017, is shown in the statement of financial position on page 11. There have been no significant events since the year end. The Company will continue to raise finance, as required, in the future. There are no plans to change the existing business model.

POLITICAL DONATIONS AND EXPENDITURE

During the year, no contributions were made to political organisations (2016: £nil).

FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

Liquidity risk

The principal risk facing the Company is not having sufficient liquidity to enable the Company to meet its liabilities as they fall due and to provide adequately for contingencies. In this respect, borrowing facilities are made available to the Company by other companies in the Northern Powergrid Group, if required. The Company continues to maintain its investment grade issuer credit rating.

Interest rate risk

The Company is financed by long-term borrowings at fixed rates and has access to short-term borrowing facilities at floating rates of interest. As at 31 December 2017, 100% of the Company's borrowings were at fixed rates and the average maturity for these borrowings was 11 years.

Currency risk

No material currency risks are faced by the Company.

Trading risk

Throughout the year under review, the Company's policy was that no trading in financial instruments should be undertaken.

Financial derivatives

As at 31 December 2017 and during the year it was the Company's policy not to hold any derivative financial instruments.

International Accounting Standard 1 requires that financial statements present fairly, for each financial year, the Company's financial position, financial performance and cash flows. This requires the faithful representation of the effects of transactions, other events and conditions in accordance with the definitions and recognition criteria for assets, liabilities, income and expenses set out in the International Accounting Standards Board's 'Framework for the Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements'. In virtually all circumstances, a fair presentation will be achieved by compliance with all IFRS.

In accordance with the Yorkshire Power Finance Limited - 7.25% £200m Bonds 2028 Trust Deed, the directors are also required to prepare accounts in such a form as will comply with all relevant legal and accounting requirements. Therefore, the directors are required to:

- Properly select and apply accounting policies;
- Present information, including accounting policies, in a manner that provides relevant, reliable, comparable and understandable information;
- Provide additional disclosures when compliance with the specific requirements in IFRS are insufficient to enable users to understand the impact of particular transactions, other events and conditions on the Company's financial position and financial performance; and
- Make an assessment of the Company's ability to continue as a going concern.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company, for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

GOING CONCERN

The Company's business activities, together with details regarding its future development, performance and position are set out in the Report of the Directors. In addition, the Company's objectives, policies and processes for managing its capital, its financial risk management objectives, details of its financial instruments and hedging activities and its exposures to credit risk and liquidity risk are included in the Report of the Directors and the appropriate notes to the accounts.

When considering continuing to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts, the directors have taken account of a number of factors that arise due to the Company being part of the Northern Powergrid Group and raising finance on behalf of Northern Powergrid (Yorkshire) plc, including the following:

- a) The Company is profitable with net current assets and access to cash as detailed in note 9 to the accounts; and
- b) Northern Powergrid (Yorkshire) plc has considerable financial resources, in the form of short-term borrowings made available by Yorkshire Electricity Group plc, a fellow company in the Northern Powergrid Group, and committed revolving credit facilities from Lloyds Bank plc, Royal Bank of Scotland plc and Abbey National Treasury Services plc.

Consequently, after making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts.

STATEMENT AS TO DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION TO AUDITOR

Each of the directors, who is a director of the Company as at the date of this report, confirms that:

- a) so far as he is aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the Company's auditor is unaware; and

Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements:

Key audit matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgement, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current period and include the most significant assessed risks of material misstatement (whether or not due to fraud) that we identified. These matters included those which had the greatest effect on: the overall audit strategy, the allocation of resources in the audit; and directing the efforts of the engagement team.

These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

Management override of controls

Key audit matter description

The risk of management override of controls due to fraud is a pervasive risk of material misstatement in the financial statements. It includes the potential for management to use their judgement to influence the financial statements as well as the potential to override the Company's controls.

The key area of risk for the Company included the posting of inappropriate journal entries or other adjustments.

matter

How the scope of our audit We identified journal entries recorded in the general ledger during the year, and other responded to the key audit adjustments made in the preparation of financial reporting, exhibiting characteristics with an increased risk of fraud or which were unexpected based on the nature of the business. The journals were identified with the use of data analytics and were tested by obtaining supporting documentation.

> We have evaluated the design and implementation of key controls around the financial reporting process.

Key observations

No matters were noted during the course of our testing that warranted reporting to those charged with governance.

Loan Valuation

Key audit matter description

The main activity of the entity is to obtain external financing for the group and to lend this to other group companies. The book value of this external financing at year end was £189.7m. These listed external borrowings can be seen in note 12, with the associated accounting policy disclosed in note 2.

As these loans are highly material for the company their fair value and book value recorded in this disclosure to the accounts were a key focus of our audit resource to ascertain whether the values were reflective of an estimate of the market value at year end.

matter

How the scope of our audit We have recalculated the fair value column of the borrowings note in the financial responded to the key audit statements by taking the market value calculated, and adjusting for expected accrued interest and payments.

> We have recalculated the book value adjusting the brought forward amounts for accrued interest and amortisation of deferred finance fees.

> We have reviewed board meeting minutes for any indication of changes to the terms or quantum of loans outstanding.

Key observations

No matters were noted during the course of our testing that warranted reporting to those charged with governance.

Our application of materiality

We define materiality as the magnitude of misstatement in the financial statements that makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable person would be changed or influenced. We use materiality both in planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work

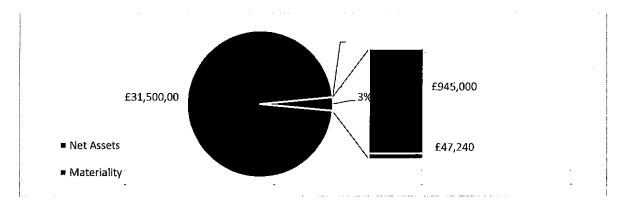
Based on our professional judgement, we determined materiality for the financial statements as a whole as follows:

Materiality £945k

Basis for determining materiality 3% of net assets.

Rationale for the benchmark applied This company is not a trading company and therefore net assets is considered

the most appropriate base as its function is to hold listed debt.



We agreed with the Board of Directors that we would report to the Board all audit differences in excess of £47,240, as well as differences below that threshold that, in our view, warranted reporting on qualitative grounds. We also report to the Board of Directors on disclosure matters that we identified when assessing the overall presentation of the financial statements.

An overview of the scope of our audit

Yorkshire Power Finance Limited is a wholly owned subsidiary of Northern Powergrid Holdings Company. The primary purpose of the entity is to obtain external finance to be provided to the remainder of the group. Audit work to respond to the risks of material misstatement was performed directly by the audit engagement team.

The focus of our audit work is to test the borrowing and lending activities of the company and associated interest, and to consider the risk of management override of controls. There have been no changes to our audit scope from the prior year.

Other information

The directors are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the annual report including the Report of the Directors, other than the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and, except to the extent otherwise explicitly stated in our report, we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If we identify such material inconsistencies or apparent material misstatements, we are required to determine whether there is a material misstatement in the financial statements or a material misstatement of the other information. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact.

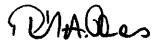

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Yorkshire Power Finance Limited (the "Company") is a company incorporated in the Cayman Islands and is part of the Northern Powergrid Holdings Company group of companies (the "Northern Powergrid Group"). The address of the registered office is PO Box 309, Ugland House, South Church Street, George Town, Grand Cayman.

The nature of the Company's operations and activities are set out in the Report of the Directors. The company is limited by shares.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention and basis of preparation

These non-statutory financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). These financial statements have also been prepared in accordance with IFRSs as adopted by the European Union and with those parts of the Companies Act 2006 (the "Act") that are applicable to companies reporting under IFRS.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for goods and services.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date, regardless of whether that price is directly observable or estimated using another valuation technique. In estimating the fair value of an asset or a liability, the Company takes into account the characteristics of the asset or liability if market participants would take those characteristics into account when pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date. Fair value for measurement and/or disclosure purposes in these financial statements is determined on such a basis.

In addition, for financial reporting purposes, fair value measurements are categorised into Level 1, 2 or 3 based on the degree to which the inputs to the fair value measurements are observable and the significance of the inputs to the fair value measurement in its entirety, which are described as follows:

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the entity can access at the measurement date;
- Level 2 inputs are inputs, other than quoted prices included within Level 1, that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

Going concern

The directors have, at the time of approving the financial statements, a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further detail is contained within the Going Concern Statement in the Report of the Directors.

Capital management

The Group manages its capital centrally to ensure that entities in the Group will be able to continue as going concerns while maximising the return to stakeholders through the optimisation of the debt and equity balance. The Group's overall strategy remains unchanged from 2016.

The capital structure of the Company consists of net debt (borrowings as detailed in note 12) offset by cash and cash equivalents (detailed in note 9) and equity of the Company (comprising issued capital, reserves and retained earnings as detailed in notes 10 and 11).

Critical accounting policies

The critical accounting policy adopted by the directors relates to borrowing costs and is described below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The fair value of amounts borrowed from other Group undertakings included in the financial statements involves the use of judgement. These judgements are based on management's best knowledge of the relevant facts and circumstances, having regard to previous experience, but actual results may differ from the amounts included in the financial statements. There are no other areas where judgements or estimation uncertainty are applicable.

Adoption of new or revised standards

Amendments to IFRSs made by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB") that are effective mandatorily for an accounting period that begins on or after 1 January 2017:

- Annual Improvements to IFRS 2014-2016 Cycle.

The Annual Improvements to IFRS 2014-2016 Cycle include a number of amendments to various IFRS. The application of these amendments has had no material impact on the Company's financial statements.

The Company has not applied the new and revised IFRS that have been issued but are not yet effective for the year ending 31 December 2017. The directors of the Company do not anticipate that the application of the new and revised IFRS will have a material impact on the Company's financial statements.

Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised on the statement of financial position when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions on the instrument.

Financial assets are assessed for indicators of impairment at each statement of financial position date. Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that, as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset, the estimated future cash flows of the investment have been impacted.

Financial liabilities and equity

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangement entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Cash and cash equivalents

Loans advanced to the parent company are included within cash equivalents, having a maturity of less than three months on the basis that they are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

Finance income

Interest income is accrued on a time basis by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable.

Taxation

The income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable.

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from 'profit before tax' as reported in the statement of profit or loss because of items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and items that are never taxable or deductible. The Company's current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Borrowings

Borrowings are classified as other financial liabilities at amortised cost. They are recorded at the proceeds received, net of direct issue costs. Finance charges, including premiums payable on settlement for redemption and direct issue costs, are accounted for on an accruals basis in the statement of profit or loss using the effective interest rate method. They are added to the carrying amount of the instruments to the extent that they are not settled in the period in which they arise.
